

Tips for writers and illustrators

- Keep your story clearly focused on **one problem** that your **superhero** will solve.
- First show your superhero as a **normal person**. Then show his **secret superpowers**. Make sure your readers can see clearly how your hero uses his superpowers to solve the problem.
- Use a simple font. **Do not use *italic* or *script fonts***. These are difficult to read for our students from Greece and Cyprus.
- Illustrators: show your hero's superpowers in the pictures.
- Fill the whole page or most of the page with your background
- Titlepage: Let's all keep the basic layout with the yellow flashes. You can change the color and add a picture of your hero.

Discuss these questions in your group.

Please speak English so everyone in the group can understand you.

- **What problem does your superhero have to solve?**
- **Where does the story play? Make a list of all the places that the illustrators have to draw or paint.**
- **Who is your superhero in real life?**
- **What are his/her secret superpowers?**
- **How does your superhero use his superpowers to solve the problem?**
