Ivan: Excited! I'm super sporty. I play football, rugby and hockey. I'm the hockey captain and I can pick my team. I love PE lessons!

Voice: Situation Two! What's the last thing you read?

Voice: Theo!

Theo: Oh, I've just finished the third Hunger Games book. They're brilliant.

Voice: Ivan!

Ivan: Er, probably the instructions on 'Fortnite'.

Voice: Situation Three! What's your perfect weekend?

Voice: Theo!

Theo: Easy! Play computer games with my friends, and we have takeaway pizza.

Voice: Ivan!

Ivan: I love going to football matches whenever my team, Arsenal, is at home. My dad has a season ticket. Arsenal!

Voice: Situation Four! Your friend invites you on a camping trip. What do you say?

Voice: Theo!

Theo: Whoa. I make an excuse! I hate being cold. No toilets, no bed, no wifi! It sounds terrible!

Voice: Ivan!

Ivan: Yes please! When do we go?! It sounds amazing!

Voice: Situation Five! It's snowing outside – what do you do?

Voice: Theo!

Theo: Er, sit in front of the fire with a film and drink the biggest hot chocolate!

Voice: Ivan!

Ivan: I put my coat on and make a snowman!

Voice: Thank you, Theo! Thank you, Ivan! The pod is now closed.

Track 3: THE CROWN STORY

Kate: In CROWN magazine, you can read about a school for orangutans!

Chris: Fantastic! And CROWN reporter, Luke, has visited the school to find out more. Here's his report.

Luke: Hi, Kate! Hi, Chris! Welcome to the jungles of Borneo. I'm at an amazing school – the Orangutan Jungle School. I'm with Nyaru. Hi, Nyaru.

Nyaru: Hi, CROWN listeners! Hi, Luke! Thank you for coming.

Luke: Nyaru, how old are these orangutans and why are they here?

Nyaru: Well, most of our orangutans are between one and two years old. They're here because they're orphans!

Luke: Oh no! Why are they orphans?

Nyaru: Because their mothers have been killed by hunters or, sometimes, in forest fires. People are burning down the forests to make plantations for palm oil.

Luke: That's terrible! Why do you call this a school? What do you teach the orangutans?

Nyaru: Well, we have lessons to teach them to climb trees, find food or build nests. We hope that one day they can go back into the wild.

Luke: How do you teach them?

Nyaru: Well, we have small classes of two or three orangutans and we give them lessons. For example, one lesson is 'finding food'. We show them how to use a stick to get insects out of a hole in a tree. Another lesson is climbing! We take the orangutans up into the trees. We put their hands on the branches and hold them there.

Luke: That's really interesting. So what's a typical school day?

Nyaru: We wake them up early, and after breakfast, we take them into the jungle for their day at school. Their school bus is a wheelbarrow! Five or six orangutans travel together in the wheelbarrow.

Luke: Oh, cute!

Nyaru: I know! They love it!

Chris: Do they have a lunch break?

Nyaru: Yes, the orangutans eat leaves, insects and fruit – lots and lots of bananas!

Luke: Ha, the food sounds better than my school

dinners! So, the orangutans live in the school. When is bed time?

Nyaru: Well, it depends how fast each baby learns. They only go into the wild when we are sure they are okay.
