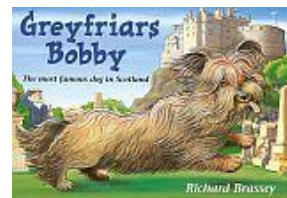



Some of the verbs have a regular past tense form (regelmäßig).



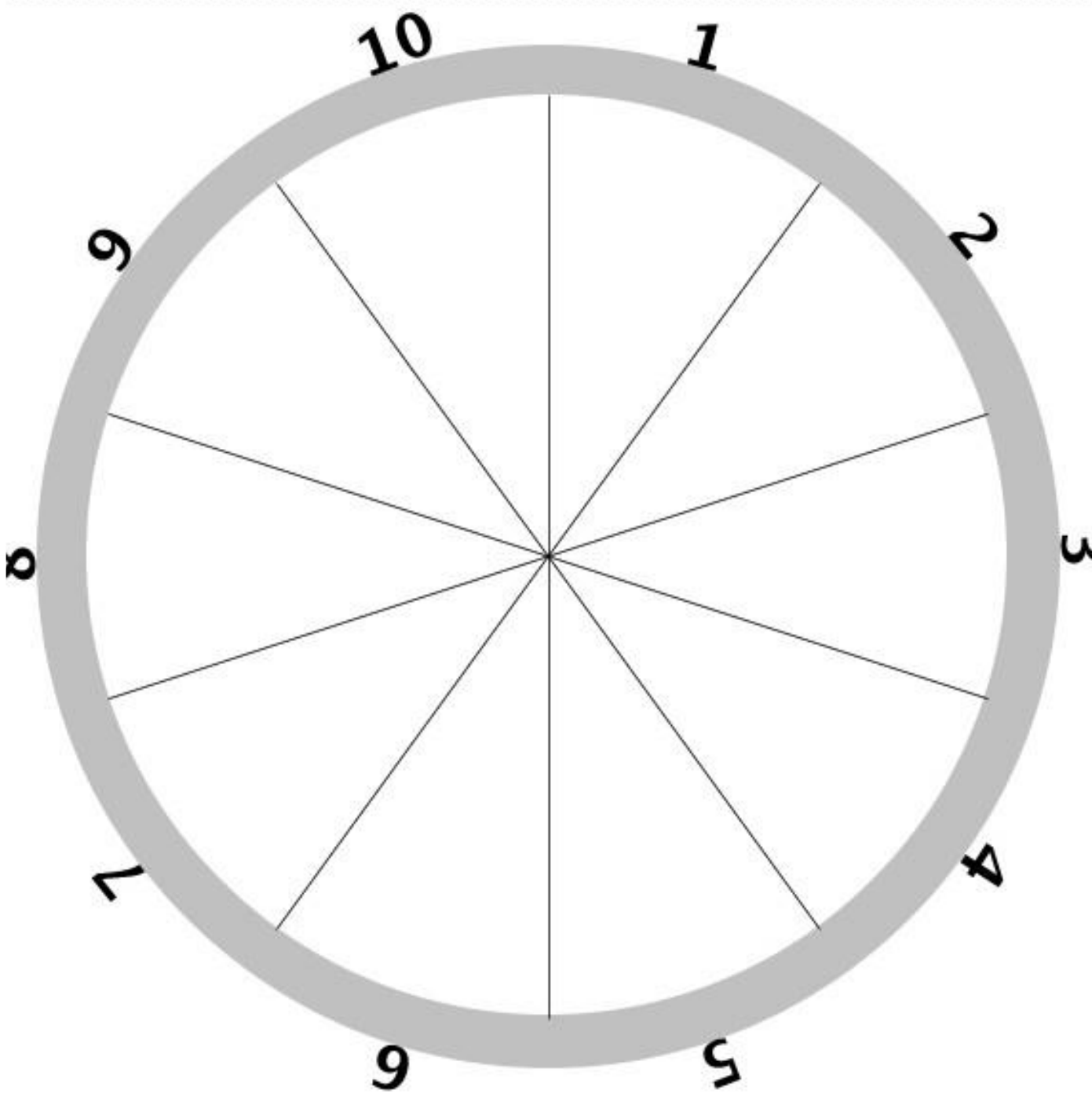

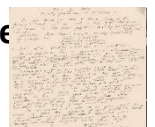
Step 1: Plan your story – Take notes!
