What's been changed?

Students memorize the position and state of everything in the room for two minutes. Students take it in turns to leave the room for one minute. During that time, the other students change five things in the room. When the student comes back, they have to identify what has been changed.

Example:

The lights have been switched off.

We use the passive form because the change is more important than who has made it and we don't know precisely who has made the change.

The perfect tense is used because we're talking about the present result of change some time before now / past actions.

You must use this structure in your answers.

Subject + has or have + past participle

When the student returns and begins identifying changes, the other students must listen carefully and confirm or deny the changes.
