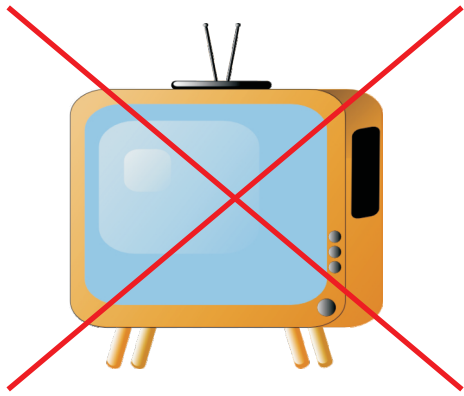



Trouble in the Hotel



Picture Cards

Preparations

1. Form a pile out of the picture cards and put it on the board.
2. Turn the text cards around so that you can't read them and distribute them around the board.

The Game:

One player starts and takes the first picture card. Then she/he tries to formulate a sentence that states what's wrong/ what's the problem (for example: "There are cockroaches in the room".)

Then this player picks up one of the text cards. If it is the right card he/ she may keep it (the sentence on the card doesn't have to be the exact same sentence that was said before as long as the meaning is the same). If the player chooses the wrong card, the picture card is restored to the pile and the text card is put back to its place.

The game ends when there are no cards left. Who would have thought that a simple stay in a hotel could be so problematic?

Ps: If you don't know a word, ask your teacher.
