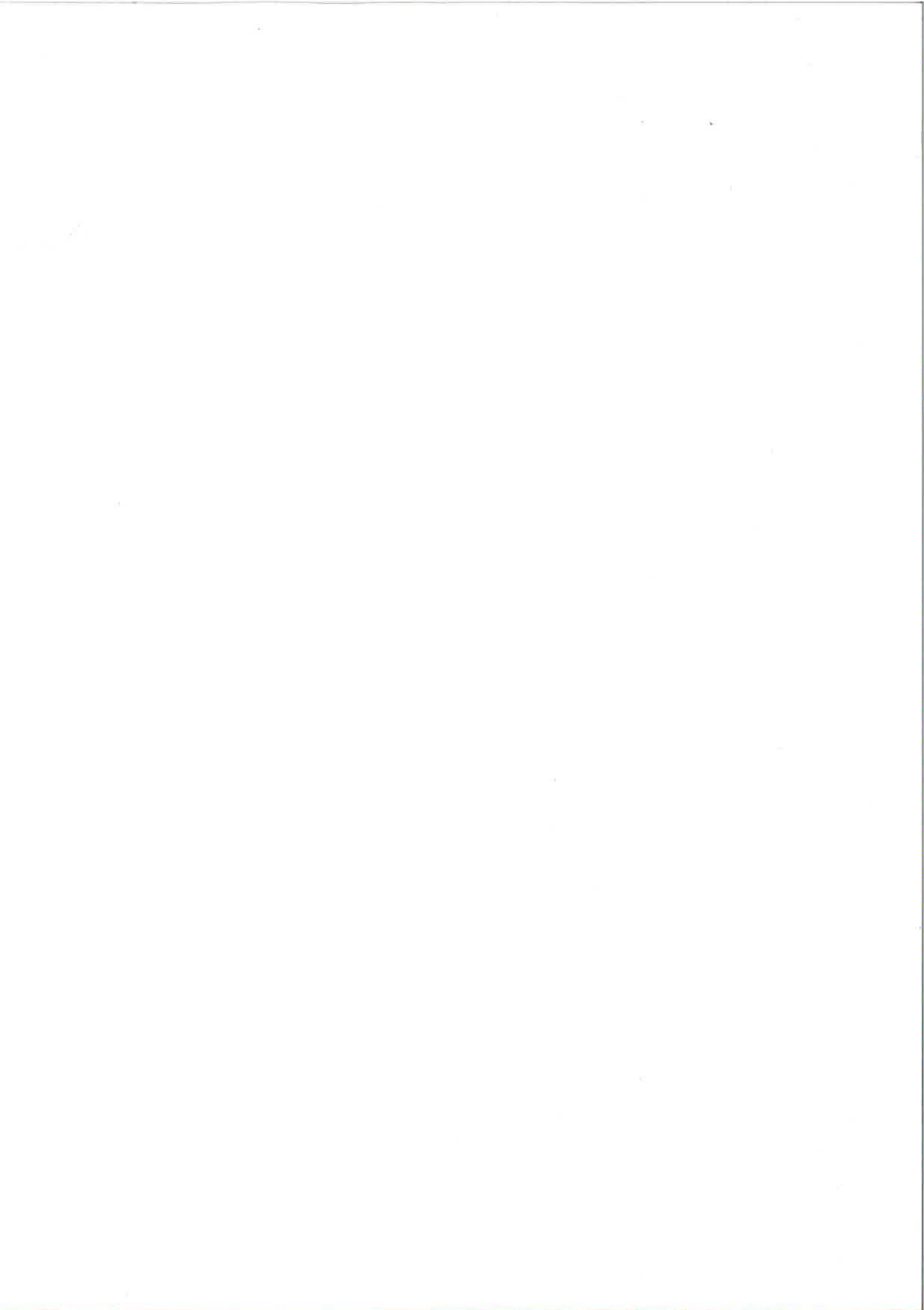

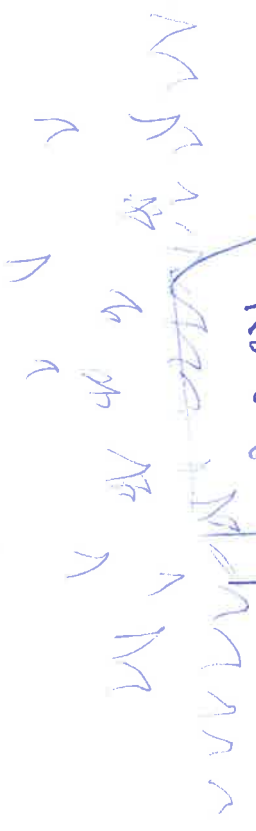

# The Sellig

It all happened in Whitechapel. In a district with a lot of narrow, dark and scary alleyways. The life there was the opposite of comfortable. 80,000 people led miserable lives there and had to fear death because of their poverty.



It was horrible to live in Whitechapel also because of the bad hygiene. One consequence of the bad hygiene was the high mortality-rate of children. More than the half of the whole children who lived there, died before they were five years old.

Children who had the 'luck' of surviving didn't even think about school or something like that. They had to help their mothers earn money by washing clothes or sewing clothes for other people. There were three different classes in this district:

The poor people, the very poor people and the lazy and poor people. The poor people builders, labourers, shopkeepers, and sweatshop workers. They always struggled to get along with their money, but they mostly had something to eat and some of them even had their own flat. But in these flats often lived seven people within very little space.

The very poor people never had enough of anything. This class mainly included women and children, who washed clothes, and saw, as I sayed before. But many women also were prostitutes, as they often had no other choice or opportunity.

The people who were poor and lazy often were criminals or just loafer. But they never had enough of anything too.

The very poor people who had no flat or any other place to sleep had to sleep on the street. If they had some money left of their work, they could go to a lodging house. This were big rooms where a lot of people could sleep in. Often there were 80 beds in one of this huge rooms.

Still I have to say the others sound suspicious too so I actually have no idea who this could have been.

Many people slept in doorways or on staircases because they had no money left. This terrible reality was too much for many people. They couldn't stand their poverty so many people drunk a lot of alcohol to escape this dreadful life. They also often drunk because they were in such a desperate situation.

Many Londoner never went to Whitechapel because of the dark and scary streets and the strange people sometimes ran around.

Prostitution was the most common job there in those days. The police said there were 1200 women in 1888 who did this job to survive but as we know the police didn't really care about the situation there so there could have been more prostitutes. These women often asked out their job in lodginghouses but also in some dark, dirty and ugly alleyways where nobody could see or hear anything.

Crime and violence was very common in this district because of the poverty of the people. They often had to steal money to buy themselves food or alcohol.

I think it was very irresponsible of the police to ignore this horrible facts and just do nothing about it. But then there started a series of crimes and the people had even more fear of death after a couple of attacks on prostitutes. Something nobody would like to think of. People say that these crimes were all committed by Jack the Ripper. But who was Jack the Ripper? Read on to hear a little more about the victims of Jack the Ripper.

# The Victims

The murderer of the following victims must be very cruel and savage. The mysterious fact that all murders happened within a square mile makes it even scarier. All the murders involved prostitutes and almost every murder was violently and brutal committed. Mutilation was also very common.



## Emma Smith

Emma Smith was a friendless widow, who had a little alcohol problem, and worked as a prostitute.

She was attacked on 3rd of April 1888 early in the morning in Bricklane. Before the murderer really hurt her, he stole all her earnings. She was badly cut, bruised about the head and bleeding internally. But the worst was that she was still alive after the attack, so she was brought to the hospital where she then, one day later, died. She implied that 3 men attacked her but Emma was in such a bad condition so we will never know if that really is true.

Her death only had little attraction and we will never know if that crime was committed by Jack the Ripper.

## Martha Tabram

Martha Tabram was killed on August the 6th 1888, she was a prostitute too and drank a lot of alcohol like Emma Smith. Before she was attacked, she was drinking with a friend in a lodging house. Martha was found in a gloomy staircase in a pool.



## Aaron Kosminski



Job: Hairdresser in Whitechapel  
Suspect because: He hated prostitutes and liked to kill. Aaron also had homicidal tendencies  
Other information: Nobody believed that he is dangerous because he seemed very innocent.

## Michael Ostrod

Job: Trained as a doctor, and had surgical skills  
Suspect because: He was convicted before for theft.  
Other information: He was Russian and was very intelligent.

**George Chapman**



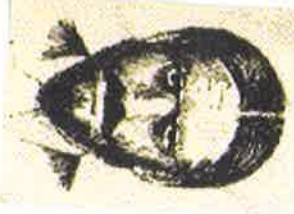
Job: Hairdresser in Whitechapel in 1888

Job: Boot maker  
Suspect because: He was part-time criminal so he pretended prostitutes to pay him protection money. But he had an impeccable alibi.  
Other information: His nickname was Leather Apron.

**Mary Ann Nichols**

Mary Ann Nichols had on the day she was killed her money left to pay the lodginghouse. She went back to the streets to earn some more money. It was August the 31st in Bude's row where she was ripped open and her throat was cut. Again nobody saw or heard anything. She was the first official Jack the Ripper victim.



**Annie Chapman**

Annie Chapman was murdered on September the 18th in Hanbury Street. Before she was killed, she was ragging with a customer in front of a house where 17 people lived in. Half an hour later she was found in the backyard of the house, and her body was gruesomely torn open. None of the 17 people heard or saw anything while the crime was committed. Next to the dead body they found a leather apron with the people think, belonged to the murderer. Till now people ignored this dreadful things but now they started caring about it.



**Elisabeth Stride**

On September the 30th Jack the Ripper struck again. But not once, twice! The first one was Elisabeth in Berner street whose throat was cut open and less than an hour later a mile away

**'Gatherine'** body was disgustingly

ripped open, more cruel than any other before. Even one kidney was taken out of her body.

Yesterday, on September the 8<sup>th</sup>, a woman was discovered completely  
disfigured, lying in the backyard of a house in Whitechappel, in  
Hanburystreet. The body was gruesomely torn open. This was the most  
dreadful mutilation of a woman that has ever happened in London. We  
suspect Jack the Ripper to be the committer of this crime.

All we know about the victim is that she worked as a prostitute in  
Whitechappel. Witnesses told us, that they saw her haggling with a  
customer, half an hour before her dead body was found in the backyard of  
the house.

The house, where she was found, is occupied by two families with four and  
five children, and seven other people. Although there were so many people  
in this house, nobody heard any noise or saw anything while the crime was  
committed. The murderer must be practiced at this.

The only indication that was found was a leather apron, which was lying  
right next to the victim. Investigators believe that the murderer has to be  
the owner of this apron because nobody else was there when the innocent  
woman was killed.

Actually there were three other prostitutes killed before in the same  
neighbourhood but we can't be sure if Jack the Ripper is responsible for  
these crimes. An occupant of the house, which is located at the scene of  
crime said: "Three successful murders will have the effect of whetting his  
appetite still further! All the people are so scared! Since these dreadful  
things have happened everyone avoids being out alone at night. I think  
there's no time to lose for the police to do something about it. Till now  
nobody really has cared for it, but this should be taken serious!" Well, we  
will do our best to inform you as soon as possible if we know something  
new about the mysterious killer Jack the Ripper.

We hope this will come to an end soon, because Whitechappel has turned  
into a place of fear and nightmares.
